

book also connects fixations on cleaning with the discovery of germs the first bacterium discovered was anthrax and knowledge of its properties increased fears of dust analyzes advertising cards for soap and links the mental illness in Gilman's *The Yellow Wall Paper* to fears during the period of arsenic poisoning from wallpaper **Charlotte Perkins Gilman**
