What To Include

Classroom Rules

Classroom rules are behavioral norms that guide and direct student actions and they must be clearly defined in a classroom management plan in a concise and specific manner.

Classroom Procedures And Routines

Classroom procedures and routines should be presented concisely, providing enough detail to ensure that the students know what is required of them at specific timeframes.

Set Clear Expectations

To ensure that you foster a healthy learning environment, set clear expectations for your students by outlining what is expected of them in the plan including accepted behavioral and academic performance standards.

Physical Environment And Lesson Plans

The arrangement of physical components of the classroom, such as desks, chairs, and tables, should be displayed on a classroom management plan. Also, the associated lesson plan should include a set of criteria for evaluating student engagement and performance during class activities.

Student Jobs

Assign specific tasks or responsibilities for students to complete during class activities to foster student accountability. Each task should align with the lesson plans and classroom procedures or routines.

Emergency Procedures

A classroom management plan should also contain contingency procedures that address any emergency or significant disruptions during class such as procedures for responding to fire, tornado, floods, and student illness.

Decide On Consequences

It should also include a set of consequences that any student will have to face if they violate the classroom rules. Decide and mention the different types of punishments according to the different severities of violation.
